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Stitch in time...RAPID's COVID Relief Work

Year 2020 started with a lot of hopes, positive vibes and much promise to look forward. Satisfied and completing most of the work promised to us by us! We were planning for next year and sudden onset of lockdown made us stay at home, being an activity-based work to no activity was very challenging for the entire team. Realizing COVID19 effects, slowly we started calling our women to understand the impact on their life and difficulties to cope with the situation. WFH (work from home) new word coined in this pandemic, few could adapt easily but many find it difficult to understand how to adapt our life and livelihood in this way, nevertheless we ensured to reach around 200+ families. With assurance from a few of our collaborations, donors for the emergency financial fund we collected our members' documents & bank account details through whats app, it's heartening to see the quick response and how well our women have adapted to the digital world, the task was completed quickly.

From April to June 2020 we could support **224 RAPID member families** with emergency financial assistance ranging from **Rs. 3000 - Rs. 5000 each** for taking care of day-to-day essentials like grocery, milk, vegetables, home rent & health-hygiene essentials. Along with this around **100 food/grocery kits** were also distributed to members. They were happy and said the assistance came in time of need. This may not be an assurance for a bright days ahead..still long way to go. Up-Skilling, Job Assistance, Continuation of their children's education are going to be our priority as we move forward.

STORY OF TRIUMPH - YASMIN

MANGALWADE

I learnt so many things from my journey. My life itself is a big lesson to me. I was born and rose in Dharwad. My father had two wives. My step mother has 6 children, 4 girls and 2 boys. My mother was a second wife. My mother name is Sakeena Hanchinal. My father is Maktum Hanchinal. We are two children to our mother. I have a younger brother. It was another level of poverty along with hatred.



In all that my brother and I started to go to school. I studied in Basel Mission Girls High School. I didn't pass 10 th grade. My father did not allow me to write re-examination. My family decided my marriage with a 23 year old person. I felt very insecure.

I had to marry. He was from Kolhapur, Maharashtra. His name is Nazir. I married at the age of 16. There was so much of struggle in my husband's house. They really did not like me. And my husband was a drunkard. I have 3 children, 2 girls Nazmin and Nazrein, and a boy, Wazir. It was very hard to manage the amount for household expenses and studies of children. I learnt basic and advanced tailoring in Kolhapur. That was great help for my children to afford school supplies. My husband never wanted to stop drinking. Along with that he started abusing my children and me. So that was the time I took a step to leave his house and return to my home in 2009, where I was allowed to breathe freely. It was the time to explain my situation to the maternal side and people in our community. Then I got the news of my husband's death in 2010. It was hard to bear the truth. My community started accusing me for his death. I had to continue my journey. I ignored everything and focused on my children's and their life. I believed that my hands had a command on the tailoring machine. So I decided to continue with that. I used to stitch cotton bags, dresses, frocks etc. I wanted to learn more about business and wanted some success.

My journey with RAPID:

I came to know about RAPID by a neighbor, and I visited them in 2012. They did my home visit. They advised me to take business class from EK Tailor, Dharwad. I started my business and I feel it was a great success. I always dreamt to have my team working for a defined goal. Vani madam was asking me about the progress of team building. She encouraged me for that. That was thing which triggered me to have team.

I always thought team management will be tough, but once you jump in sea, you will learn swimming. We (our team) were ready to accept the huge orders. First order was in 2019 August. RAPID had big order of making 110 lahenga blouse for children. We were given 15 days to complete the order, We were 6 members in our team. We completed that in 8 dedicated days. Vani madam was very happy. Seeing her we felt very encouraged. It was for the orphanage in Hubli. And the best thing we delivered the order to those children and seeing them happy was a complete bliss. We are grateful to RAPID. Then we were ready for the next order. Then coordinated with RAPID in making laptop bags, luggage bags etc. Working with RAPID is an enthusiastic experience.

Our work not stopped in lockdown:

In Covid - 19 breakdown, the crucial situation was faced by daily wage people. In our community, work was needed by almost everybody. So our team decided to make masks. At the end of March we started making masks on a small scale. Praveen Nishanimath Sir of Deshpande foundation gave us an order of making 10000 cloth masks. Our team and some other women started working on it. We were restless but still happy. Till now we received so many orders and we sewed around 30,000 cloth masks. We also appeared in a news newspaper (Prajawani & Deccan Herald) for our work, it was a very beautiful feeling.

About Yasmin:

It was a very instant connection that happened with Yasmeen, she speaks very good Kannada, always smiles on her face with a lot of positivity. She is ready to take any responsibility assigned to her. She will surely become a great leader soon and make every woman proud. I wish her all the best.

Lalita Desai and Nazia Sheikh. Bag Training 20 women (5 patterns) and Gonde training 20 women. Lalita enjoyed teaching gonde to them. She used to teach them in Kannada, it was interesting to teach them in action. She taught them 10 patterns of tassles. She shared "Women were really dedicated to the work and were learning very quickly. I was inspired by them". Nazia enjoyed teaching Bags to them. She taught them 5 patterns of bags. She shared "women of shirasgaon were hardworking and dedicated. We really enjoyed teaching them. Their discipline was very appreciable.
